- 1. What is the main topic of Federalist No. 10?
- 2. How does Madison define a "pure democracy?" How well does this describe contemporary democratic governments?
- 3. How does Madison define "republican government?" How well does this describe contemporary democratic governments?
- 4. What are representatives supposed to "pronounce" in their position? Is this different from just doing what the people want?
- 5. What would it mean to "enlarge and refine" the views of ordinary citizens, as Madison says representatives should do?
- 6. What problems does Madison point to regarding pure democracy, especially regarding its applicability to the United States? How does republican government remedy them?
- 7. How does a republican government "break and control" the "violence" of factions?
- 8. After reading this text, why do you think it is misleading to say that the United States is "a republic, not a democracy?"
