- 1. What is the freedom of self-determination? What 'perplexing question' does it generate? How does democracy answer that question?
- 2. To what extent are we morally responsible for the actions of our government? Does that differ between democracies and non-democracies? Why or why not?
- 3. How might democracy encourage full human development? Do you agree with Dahl's argument here?
- 4. Why might a more democratic world be a more peaceful one?
- 5. How have the developments of the last two centuries changed the traditional wisdom about the relationship between democracies and prosperity?
- 6. Do any of the advantages of democracy Dahl suggests seem unlikely or questionable to you? Which ones and why?
- 7. Do any of the advantages stand out to you as especially important or valuable compared to the others? If so, why?
