- 3. What is "disparate impact?" How and why did it disappear from American jurisprudence?
- 4. Why did Justice Brennan say that the Supreme Court was afraid of "too much justice?"
- 5. How does Greene suggest "slippery slope" arguments help limit the scope of rights in the US context?
- 6. What question did the court in the South Africa case ask after determining that there was disparate impact on the basis of race? How did this question affect the substantive questions that guided the court's ultimate decision?
- 7. What three questions does the "proportionality" approach to rights and judicial decision making invite us to ask? How do these questions affect judicial decision making?
