Please read the selection from W. E. B. Du Bois's *Black Reconstruction*. Then consider the following questions:

- 1. Who were the "planters" or the planter class in 19th century Southern society? Look this up if you don't know.
- 2. What interests do white and black laborers have in common according to Du Bois?
- 3. Why might it be advantageous for white and black laborers to unite politically? What goals would they share? Who would be their chief political opponents?
- 4. What method was developed to drive a wedge between white and black workers?
- 5. What is the "public and psychological wage" that white laborers received? What are some examples of it?
- 6. How did the division fostered between white and black laborers enable them to be "kept low?"
- 7. Why did labor organizers make so little headway in the South, according to Du Bois?
- 8. What was the effect of this social and political arrangement on Black Americans? Can you think of other effects it might have had on American society and history?
